These are careful and uncertain times, guidelines are in place for all our sakes – stewards will be working to help keep us all safe, please respect and follow their requests as necessary.

To help yourself and others:

- remember to keep a distance of 2m from others. Masks are to be worn (unless you are exempt) but they are not a substitute for distancing.
- Track and Trace: if you have the **NHS Covid-19 app**, use the QR code at the entrance, otherwise fill in your name and phone number on the slip that you will find in the pew – these will be kept for 3 weeks.
- spoken responses should be said in a normal speaking voice.
- Communion will be given in one kind (bread only) into your hands, follow the direction of the priest. The words of distribution will be said to the congregation altogether and then the bread administered in silence. If you come for a prayer of blessing, this will be in the form of a sign of the cross made silently over you. There is no obligation to receive the bread as part of your communion.
- at the end of the service please take this booklet away and bring it with you next time you come.
- do not linger at the end of the service, it's ok to sit and listen to any music that is playing but if you want to talk to someone, please go outside first.

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The Eucharist

As the service begins a welcome and any notices are given, and Banns of Marriage may be read.

¶ The Gathering

The Greeting

The president greets the people

Grace, mercy and peace
from God our Father
and the Lord Jesus Christ
be with you

All **and also with you.**

Words of welcome or introduction may be said.

Prayer of Preparation

This prayer is said

All **Almighty God,
to whom all hearts are open,
all desires known,
and from whom no secrets are hidden:
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts
by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit,
that we may perfectly love you,
and worthily magnify your holy name;
through Christ our Lord.
Amen.**

This invitation to confession, or other suitable words

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven, and to bring us to eternal life. Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

All **Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned
in thought, word and deed.
We have not loved you with our whole heart.
We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.
In your mercy
forgive what we have been,
help us to amend what we are,
and direct what we shall be;
that we may do justly, love mercy,
and walk humbly with you, our God.
Amen.**

The president says

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent,
have mercy upon you,
pardon and deliver you from all your sins,
confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,
and keep you in life eternal;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

Gloria in Excelsis

The Gloria in excelsis may be used

All **Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.
Amen.**

The Collect

The president introduces a period of silent prayer with the words 'Let us pray' or a more specific bidding. The Collect is said, and all respond (The Collect for the week can be found on pages 11-12 of this booklet)

All **Amen.**

¶ The Liturgy of the Word

Readings

Two readings from Scripture precede the Gospel reading.

At the end of each the reader says

This is the word of the Lord.

All **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Reading

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

All **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All **Praise to you, O Christ.**

The Creed

On Sundays and Principal Holy Days an authorized translation of the Nicene Creed is used.

All **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.**

**For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary
and was made man.**

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory to judge
the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son
is worshipped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.**

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

**We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come.**

Amen.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray
All **Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours
now and for ever.
Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.
All **Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

The Agnus Dei is used as the bread is broken

All **Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.
Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us.
Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us peace.**

Giving of Communion

The president this invitation to communion

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.
**Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.**

The words of distribution are said to all before the congregation receives.

The body and blood of Christ keep you in eternal life
All **Amen.**

The president and people receive communion. Communion will be given in one kind (bread only) into the hands. The words of distribution having been spoken to all, administration will take place without further words being used. All who wish to may receive but there is no obligation to do so.

To receive, please approach down the centre aisle from the back, using the hand sanitizer at the front of the nave, and return to your seat via the side aisles.

Prayer after Communion

Silence is kept. The Post Communion prayer is said by the president (The prayer for the week can be found on pages 11-12 of this booklet) then all say

All **Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.**

¶ The Dismissal

The president may use this, or another suitable blessing

The God of all grace,
who called you to eternal glory in Christ Jesus,
establish, strengthen and settle you in the faith;
and the blessing ...

All **Amen.**

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

All **In the name of Christ. Amen.**

The ministers and people depart.

Readings, Collects and Post-Communion Prayers

4th October The 17th Sunday after Trinity

Exodus 20:14, 7-9, 12-20; Psalm 19; Philippians 3:4b-14. Matthew 21:33-end

Collect

Almighty God, you have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless till they find their rest in you: pour your love into our hearts and draw us to yourself, and so bring us at last to your heavenly city where we shall see you face to face; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion

Lord, we pray that your grace may always precede and follow us, and make us continually to be given to all good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

11th October The 18th Sunday after Trinity

Exodus 32:1-14; Psalm 106:1-6, 19-23 ; Philippians 4:1-9; Matthew 22:1-14

Collect

God, our judge and saviour, teach us to be open to your truth and to trust in your love, that we may live each day with confidence in the salvation which is given through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Post Communion

We praise and thank you, O Christ, for this sacred feast: for here we receive you, here the memory of your passion is renewed, here our minds are filled with grace, and here a pledge of future glory is given, when we shall feast at that table where you reign with all your saints for ever.

18th October Luke the Evangelist

Isaiah 35:3-6, Psalm 147:1-7; 2 Timothy 4:5-17; Luke 10:1-9

Collect

Almighty God, you called Luke the physician, whose praise is in the gospel, to be an evangelist and physician of the soul: by the grace of the Spirit and through the wholesome medicine of the gospel, give your Church the same love and power to heal; through Jesus Christ, your Son our Lord who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion

Lord God, the source of truth and love, keep us faithful to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, united in prayer and the breaking of bread, and one in joy and simplicity of heart.

25th October **Last after Trinity**

Deut 34:1-12; Psalm 90:1-6, 13-end; 1 Thess 2:1-8; Matthew 22:34-end

Collect

Merciful God,
teach us to be faithful
in change and uncertainty,
that trusting in your word
and obeying your will
we may enter the unfailing joy
of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Post Communion

God of all grace,
your Son Jesus Christ fed the hungry
with the bread of his life
and the word of his kingdom:
renew your people with your heavenly grace,
and in all our weakness
sustain us by your true and living bread;
who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

1st November **All Saints' Day**

Revelation 7:9-end; Psalm 34:1-10; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12

Collect

Almighty God,
you have knit together your elect
in one communion and fellowship
in the mystical body of your Son
Christ our Lord: grant us grace
so to follow your blessed saints
in all virtuous and godly living
that we may come to those
inexpressible joys
that you have prepared
for those who truly love you;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion

God,
the source of all holiness
and giver of all good things:
may we who have shared at this table
as strangers and pilgrims
here on earth
be welcomed with all your saints
to the heavenly feast
on the day of your kingdom;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
