WHY GIVE?

All that we are and all that we have comes from God. Every moment of the day, God's grace surrounds us, and there is nothing we can do or say to be loved more by God than we already are.

Throughout the Bible, people respond to this love with a joyful giving from what God has given in the first place. They would give a regular gift, as well as one-off gifts, giving the first fruit of a harvest, or a special offering as thanksgiving for a new baby. The Bible asks us to consider how we might do this today; using what we have for others' benefit and for God's glory. Giving in this way helps others, and it is a sign of thankfulness for God's blessings and of our commitment to God's work on earth.



Why not read a relevant passage of scripture and pray for God's guiding grace as you review your giving?

Matthew 25.14-30 2 Corinthians 8 and 9, and 1 Timothy 6.17-19 Matthew 6.19-21 Acts 2.44-47 and Acts 4.32 Jesus' parable of the talents. Paul's encouragement to church members. Where our treasure is. How the early church did it.

OUR VISION

Increasingly we are growing together: three churches in one benefice – sharing ministry and mission across our communities. The life and work of our churches continues to grow: from our prayer and worship on Sundays and midweek, to the spiritual and pastoral care of those who are bereaved or in need, to support of local nursing homes, work with schools and young people and pioneer outreach.

Our vision is to grow in the following ways:

- In reach: as we seek to serve our community
- In care: as we support one another
- In joy: as we worship together
- In faith: as we know God more day by day
- In gladness: as we partner with others in our wider church family

We want to live Christ's story in our own place and also alongside our Archbishop in the diocese, beyond our own boundaries, supporting a wider mission particularly in parishes in areas of deprivation.



THE CHALLENGES WE FACE

Across our churches we consistently receive less income each year than we spend, relying on reserves to fill the gap, and reserves won't last forever.



In recent years we have used legacies to support things we would not otherwise have been able to afford, such as routine and major building works. We have also established the invaluable Children and Families ministry, which now needs to be funded from our regular giving rather than through legacies which is unpredictable.

We are also part of the wider church through the Diocese of York. For a while now we have been blessed to be able to give to the common fund of the diocese in such a way that covers the costs of our clergy also contribute to clergy costs in places of deprivation in the diocese, so that churches can flourish.

We would love to have the resources going forward to follow our vision and to grow. For us to be able to care for our historic places of worship, and even to expand their use for our community we need your help: in prayer, in giving your time and skill, and in financial support, that as we share in the joy of generosity, we will see our historic places of worship cared for and used for the wellbeing of the community.

ALL SAINTS CHURCH

At All Saints, in the heart of its community, all are welcome to join in worship, fellowship and prayer. Whether it is worship services, or groups welcoming children and youth, families, prayer groups, music-making, or Mother's Union there is something for everyone. We use the church to meet together socially, to mark life events, for pastoral care, and to nurture our faith through prayer and study groups. Our building is a place of historic interest, it has had many changing faces over the centuries, and provides a safe space for refuge, to light a candle, or to simply be.

MONEY MATTERS

A way to think about Financial Giving

Regular planned giving is a commitment as part of our own discipleship, as we respond to the generosity of God. Planned, regular giving the easiest and most effective way to give, and it gives greater certainty about what is coming in month by month. Restricted Funds and Legacies

We do have reserves that have built up over recent years that have been received from legacies. However, these are largely tied up either in property such as the curate's house, or are funds that are restricted as to their use, in accordance with the wishes of the respective donors.



MONEY MATTERS

All Saints and St James

The PCC has regular fabric costs of very nearly £1,000 a week. For every £10 the PCC receives we spend:



£4.60 on Mission and Ministry £2.60 on Care of Buildings £2 on Outreach, Education and Charitable Giving 80p on Administration, Communication and IT

- We spend around £620 per month on ministry and worship.
- Our regular building costs are about £270 per month. All maintenance and care costs are extra.
- Our regular income falls short of our regular expenditure by more than a third.
- Fundraising supports this but has not happened for the past two years. Regular planned giving would really help redress the situation.
